



Hey, Nova Scotia! **HAVE HEARING LOSS?**

There may be financial assistance available to you.



PRIVATE HEALTH PLANS

Many adults have extended health benefits through their employer or through other insurance plans (such as Greenshield and Blue Cross). These plans will cover varying amounts toward the cost of hearing devices, usually at repeating intervals (for example, every 3 or 5 years are common intervals).

DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY SERVICES

If you receive income assistance from the Department of Community Services due to a disability, you may qualify for their Workplace Support Program.

SPECIAL NEED ASSISTANCE

For people with special needs, the Employment Support & Income Assistance program may help purchase hearing aids.

WORKERS' COMPENSATION BOARD (WCB)

You may have a history of occupational noise exposure. WCB provides hearing aids, batteries, and repairs for those who suffered hearing loss from occupational noise exposure. Claims can be processed even in retirement. It is never too late to apply. Those covered under WCB receive new hearing aids every 5 years. We can also assist you in completing your WCB claim form.

VETERANS AFFAIRS CANADA (VAC)

Any veteran could qualify for coverage through VAC if hearing loss is determined to be due, in part, to military noise exposure. VAC will cover a new set of hearing devices every 4 calendar years, as well as repairs and batteries.

INDIGENOUS SUPPORT

Coverage for hearing aids may be available through FNIHB (First Nations and Inuit Health Branch). Our team can help with eligibility questions and paperwork.

FINANCING OPTIONS

For those who are unable to pay for hearing devices in full up-front, we offer in-house financing options with affordable payment plans and no credit checks.
